We are now sharing our world with the last living survivors of the atomic bomb attacks on Hiroshima and Nagasaki, at a critical moment when misguided United States policies are undermining the decades long drive to prevent the spread of nuclear weapons around the globe. All are invited to attend a program designed to commemorate the victims of the first atomic bomb attack and to help spur the actions required of us all to abolish nuclear weapons from our world before it is too late.

The Rockefeller Chapel program will be followed by a symbolic procession to extinguish the nuclear weapons "flame" at the nearby Henry Moore sculpture, near the site of historic nuclear fission experiments that paved the way to the construction of the first atomic bombs.
